Flowering Dogwood – food for fall migrants

Red Osier Dogwood – berries, nesting potential

Yellow-twig Dogwood – berries, nesting potential

American Hazelnut – nuts attract jays, nuthatches, etc

Beaked Hazelnut – nuts attract jays, nuthatches, etc

Bush Honeysuckle

Creeping Wintergreen – birds feed on berries in winter

Winterberry – birds feed on berries in winter

Eastern Red Cedar – winter berries, nesting potential

Spicebush – energy-rich berries for fall migrants

Sweetbay Magnolia – provides seeds in fall

Oak – acorns attract jays and mammals

Staghorn Sumac – provides winter bird food

Swamp Rose – nests for thrushes, towhees, etc

Am. Black Elderberry – nectar, fruit and insects

GRASSES

Chasmanthium latifolium	Northern Sea Oates – seed and cover
Schizachyrium scoparium 'Prairie Blues'	Little Bluestem – winter seeds for sparrows & cover
